<p>Literacy</p> <p>Key words</p> <p>Clothes line clues to the jobs people do</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=NqO6Url1sig</p> <p>This week children will have fun learning about these jobs people do. Listen to the story and then on a large paper write all the jobs from the book saying the job and letters as you write them.</p> <p>Have sentence strip paper cut into 4" or 5" lengths for children to write their Key Words. They can chose which job they want to 'write' or draw and take that word with them. Ask questions about the job or clues from the book they remember. They can do as many as the want and can take their key words home to read to their family.</p> <p>Start talking to parents about what jobs do they do for next week.</p>	<p>Math</p> <p>Measuring Blocks</p> <p>Materials: rulers, measuring tape, paper , pencils</p> <p>Here are some jobs from our book that use math in their work. Let's do some measurement like carpenters. Measure the small, medium and large blocks in the block area. Make a graph of the results.</p> <p>Children can talk about what they know about carpenters and what they want to know.</p> <p>Extensions are building structures with the blocks or real wood working with small hammers, nails and soft wood and goggles.</p> <p>Math jobs Mail carrier chef carpenter</p> <p>Next week we will learn about jobs parents do. Ask parents about their jobs and create a list. Ask if they can send any pictures or materials that could be used for play acting, or any written material used at their job for props in the play acting or a writing activity.</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Building a space ship</p> <p>Materials: cardboard, tape, blocks,</p> <p>Here are some of the jobs from our book that use science skills in their work. Let's study the stars like an astronaut.</p> <p>Sometime even when the sun is bright you can see the moon. Do you see the moon today? Let's build a space ship from cardboard or blocks and be astronomers going up to the moon. Children can do a count down and blast off. What do they see in outer space? What will they need on their space ship?</p> <p>Science jobs Astronaut Farmer firefighter</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Painting a cake</p> <p>Materials, cake shapes cut out, paint, brushes, paper, pencils</p> <p>Here are some of the jobs from our book that use art skills in their work. Let's decorate a cake like a baker.</p> <p>Children can paint a beautiful cake. Cut out the shape and let the children create the colors and designs. Ask them, what flavor cake and frosting did they make? Extension they can dictate the cake type and recipe to add to their delicious painting. Set up a bakery in the dramatic play area</p> <p>Art jobs Artist chef</p>	<p>Social emotional</p> <p>Guess the Job Game:</p> <p>Start by reading the Clothesline Clues book again. Remind children these are clues to guess a job and now we are going to make up our own clues and act them out.</p> <p>Children can take turns pretending to be a community worker from the book and the other children will guess. They can look at the book for ideas and then act out the job.</p> <p>Pretend play your favorite community helper. For example for a baker pretend to mix up the recipe in a big bowl and put it in the oven.</p> <p>Extension</p> <p>Clue making game</p> <p>Children can tell the group clues about the community worker and the group tries to guess.</p> <p>This person wears a white apron and bakes delicious bread, what is he? A Baker</p> <p>Children can draw the helper and teachers write the clue.</p>
