<p>Literacy Book Making Materials: paper and color pencils</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>The Very Hungry Caterpillar</u></p> <p>Listen to Michelle Obama read the book, The Very Hungry Caterpillar.</p> <p>Now make your own picture book. You can draw a picture on each page. An adult can add words if you want to dictate your story.</p> <p>Page 1 What happened first?</p> <p>Page 2 What were some of the healthy foods the caterpillar ate?</p> <p>Page 3 What were some of the unhealthy foods?</p> <p>Page 4 What did the caterpillar build around himself?</p> <p>Last Page Draw your beautiful butterfly!</p> <p>Now go read your story to someone. You are now an author of your own book.</p> <p>Possible DRDP measures: SED 1, LLD 1, LLD 6, LLD 10, ELD 1, ELD 3</p>	<p>Math Caterpillar Math Patterns</p> <p>Materials: Paper or paper towel rolls Pre-cut circle and semicircle shapes Glue, crayons, and scissors</p> <p>Draw and color circles and semicircle shapes and cut the circles out. What colors will you make? Sort them by color, size, and shape.</p> <p>How many circles or semicircles does your caterpillar need? Arrange them onto a piece of paper or paper towel roll. They may become a pattern or very colorful caterpillar. Glue them on a piece of paper or paper towel roll to create a caterpillar.</p> <p>How many circles did it take to make a caterpillar? Finally draw legs. How many legs does your caterpillar have?</p> <p>Possible DRDP measures: COG 2, COG 3, COG 4, COG 7</p>	<p>Science Butterfly Nature Hunt</p> <p>Yesterday we created caterpillars from circles with lots of colors and patterns. Today check out this video of butterflies. You can observe them fly, sip nectar and watch as camouflage themselves by plants and trees.</p> <p><u>Beautiful Rainforest Butterflies</u></p> <p>Now take a nature walk and be on the lookout for butterflies.</p> <p>What colors do you see on the butterfly? How many butterflies did you see? Draw a picture of a caterpillar and a butterfly camouflaged in a tree or plant.</p> <p>Possible DRDP measures: LLD 4, Cog 6, COG 7</p>	<p>Art Butterfly Art</p> <p>Materials: Pipe cleaners, round coffee filters, markers</p> <p>You can use your color pens to draw on to your coffee filter.</p> <p>Draw patterns or shapes and use lots of colors. Take your time drawing on the coffee filter. Think about all the butterflies you saw yesterday. When you are finished drawing pinch in the middle and wrap your pipe cleaner around. Curl up the ends of the pipe cleaner for the butterfly's antennas and spread out the wings</p> <p>Now take your butterfly out for a fly</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>Possible DRDP measures: SED 5, LLD 1, ELD 1, COG 7</p>	<p>Social Dramatic Play Making Butterfly Wings</p> <p>Materials: Construction paper, paint, scissors, tape</p> <p>Use construction paper to cut out butterfly wings! The kids can paint their wings however they'd like. They can paint half the paper and fold it over to make both sides the same, or they could paint the whole thing.</p> <p>After they are dry, you can tape the wings onto the children's back and they can fly around as butterflies.</p> <p>Possible DRDP measures: SED 5, LLD 3, ELD 2, COG 6, COG 7</p>
