Theme: Family Traditions

<p>Literacy Family Traditions are the things families do that reflect and reinforce a family's values, attitudes and beliefs. This month we will learn about family traditions.</p> <p>How Do Dinosaurs Say Good night? https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=K7EHWBKSZic</p> <p>Materials: paper and pens</p> <p>How do you say good night at your house? Each child can dictate their traditional bed time routine at the top of their paper, do they brush teeth, read a story, sing a song, say the same thing each night?</p> <p>Now children can draw a picture of how they say good night at their house.</p>	<p>Math Materials: pens, paper, dice, small dinosaurs</p> <p>Dinosaur Race to Bed Draw a cool winding path on a large sheet of paper and divide the path into squares. You can draw a tooth brush, drink of water, book, whatever kids think the dinosaurs do on their way to bed. At the end draw a bed for the dinosaur. Children can take turns rolling their dice and counting how many spaces they can move until they get their dinosaur to bed.</p> <p>Ask Parents if there are special songs or stories they sing/tell at bed time. On Friday children can use their playdough to make a bed for their dinosaur and teachers/children can sing the family songs/ tell the family stories as they play with the dinosaurs and playdough</p>	<p>Science Each child can have their own bowl and follow the playdough recipe</p> <p>No Cook Playdough Ingredients 1/2 cup flour 1/4 cup salt 1/2Tbsp cream of tartar 1/2Tbsp oil Liquid watercolors (or food coloring) 1/2cup boiling water</p> <p>Instructions</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Mix dry ingredients in a bowl. Make a well in the center and add oil and coloring. Pour in boiling water and mix. It will look like a goopy mess and you're going to be sure that you're going to have to add a lot of flour to make it work. Just let it sit for a few minutes. It will firm up and work perfectly. Take the dough out of the bowl and knead it a bit to form a ball. <p>Play!</p>	<p>Art Materials: small dinosaurs, nature items like twigs, leaves, pebbles, small cups of paint, paper.</p> <p>Children can dip dinosaur's feet in the paint and make tracks, use the twigs, leaves, pebbles to paint with or print with or glue to the paper. They can create a natural habitat with the nature items and dinosaur tracks.</p>	<p>Sensory Dinosaur playdough Materials: each child's playdough, and small plastic dinosaurs. Books that parents use at bedtime to share</p> <p>Children can make a bed for their dinosaur with their playdough. Teachers can use the information from the parents to tell a story or sing a song. "Max's family likes to read the story, goodnight moon at bedtime. That is their family bedtime tradition." "Mia's Mom likes to sing the song, you are my sunshine at bedtime. That is her family bedtime tradition"</p>
