<b>My Family Book</b>	<b>Building My House</b>	<b>If I Could Paint My House....</b>	<b>Family Faces</b>	<b>Where Shall We Go?</b>
<p>Listen to this story about <a href="#">why families are different</a>, and then you're going to create your own story about your own, unique family!</p> <p>Today, encourage your child to talk about each family member and draw a picture of that member. Write a conversation starter on each page for each family member. The child draws about that person and you print on their page what they say:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">I love my Mom because...</p> <p style="text-align: center;">My sister/brother and I like to _____</p> <p>At the end of the unit, you will have a great family book to share with those you love.</p> <p>Encourage your child to attempt to trace your words or write by themselves in any way they are able to.</p>	<p>Sit on the floor with the child and build a structure together using building blocks. As your child builds the structure, ask her to name the block shapes she is using. If she doesn't know the name of the shapes, name them for her. You might also ask, "How many squares did you use? Did you use any triangles? What shape are going to use next?"</p> <p>Once the block structure is complete, you and your child can count the number of blocks used or the number of blocks left over. Together you can also practice measuring the building. For example, "The building is five blocks high."</p> <p><a href="#">This website</a> gives 8 ideas on how to play with blocks with your child. Have fun!</p>	<p>What color would your child choose if they could paint <a href="#">their house</a>?? Find out with this science activity idea!</p> <p>Materials needed: Provide paint cups with different colors and paper</p> <p>Provide each child with their own clear paint cup and a paint brush.</p> <p>Teach them how to mix the colors together.</p> <p>Let them create their own colors.</p> <p>You can then help them paint a picture of their house using the colors they created.</p>	<p>Materials Needed: paper plates (many!), markers, precut yarn in different colors, buttons or googly-eyes, glue, craft sticks</p> <p>The children use the materials to make the faces of members of their families. Ask questions to help them such as "What color eyes does your Mom have? What color hair? Does your dad have a beard?"</p> <p>For some extra fun, listen to this <a href="#">song about funny faces</a> and use it to inspire creativity when creating their plate faces!</p>	<p>Watch <a href="#">this video</a> about all the different places your family can go in their car.</p> <p>Place many chairs together as a car and let your child/children take turns being the person driving the family to some fun activities such as to.....</p> <p style="text-align: center;">the park, school, work, supermarket, etc.</p> <p>Provide the driver with a makeshift steering wheel and the others with activities they might do in a car.</p>
