<p>Literacy Activity</p> <p>Story Comprehension Materials: paper and pencil</p> <p>Stella Luna By Janell Cannon</p> <p>Listen to this story about Stella Luna and her bird friends. They are so different but feel so much alike. It's a mystery but they are friends indeed.</p> <p>After listening to the story about Stella Luna try to make a list of the many ways they are different and then ways they are the same.</p> <p>How are they different? What they eat... Where they live... How they fly... How they look... What else?</p> <p>Now how are they the same? Who do they like? What do they like to do together? How they look? What else?</p>	<p>Math Activity</p> <p>Bat math Materials: paper, color pencils and dice It's easy to make your own math games. On a piece of paper draw a little Stella Luna at the bottom at the paper and at the top draw a red ripe mango! Now connect the two with 10-15 little squares in a zig zag pattern. Make a small Bat shape for each player.</p> <p>To play the game: roll the dice and count how many squares Stella Luna can move up to the Mango. For example if you roll a 2 move up 2 squares, if you roll a 4 move up 4 squares ...</p> <p>Each turn roll the dice and then count until Stella Luna gets to the top and to her delicious Mango.</p> <p>If you don't have a dice you can make it out of paper: Make 6 small pieces of paper and put a number on each one, 1,2,3,4,5,6. Put the little papers in a cup and each turn you can draw out a paper and move the amount on the paper.</p>	<p>Science Activity</p> <p>Paper airplanes</p> <p>Materials: paper and color crayons First draw on your paper and write your name. Next, with the help of an adult follow the steps to make a paper airplane</p> <p>Now have fun doing some flying experiment. How far can your airplane fly? Make a prediction and then test it out. What makes it fly the furthest do you guess? What makes it fly in a straight line? What makes it fly up?</p>	<p>Art Activity</p> <p>Tree silhouette painting</p> <p>Materials: paper, black paint and paint brush</p> <p>Remember the trees in the book Stella Luna. In the night sky the trees look like silhouettes.</p> <p>Use your paint brush and black paint to paint the long lines of the trees.</p> <p>Start by observing a tree. Look at where it meets the ground. The tree trunk is widest at the bottom.</p> <p>Then look upwards and notice how it gets thinner and thinner until at the top it looks like little twigs.</p> <p>When the paint is dry use your colored pencils to add birds or a birds nest or Stella Luna.</p>	<p>Social Emotional/Movement Activity</p> <p>Friendship fruit salad</p> <p>Materials: different fruits, cutting board, a small knife and a bowl. Paper and pencil</p> <p>Chose different fruits to cut up and put together in a bowl. The different fruits taste so delicious together. That's how friends are, so different but so good together!</p> <p>Make a list of the fruit you cut and when you eat your fruit salad ask your friends or family which fruit was their favorite.</p>

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
