Theme: Community Helpers

<p>Literacy</p> <p>Parent Community Worker Mural and Key Words</p> <p>Materials: Mural Paper, pens, glue, sentence strips cut into 4" pieces and pencils</p> <p>Parents are community helpers. Parents do many jobs that helps our community. This week we will learn more about all the interesting work our parents do. Begin a school community worker mural by writing the parents name and the job they do. Add pictures, and other things parents brought from their job. Each child can draw next to their family name.</p> <p>Teacher writes Key Words on pieces of sentence strips from last week's jobs and add new words from the jobs parents do. Children can copy words and draw on the sentence strip paper and take home new Key Words.</p>	<p>Math</p> <p>Making Money, writing numbers</p> <p>Materials: paper, pens, cash register</p> <p>Using your list of parent jobs find a job that uses math skills to develop an activity around.</p> <p>If a parent works at a store or bank children can first make money as an activity. Cut rectangles of green paper and the children can write numbers on the paper to make lots of money to use in the store. Then set up cash registers to take the money.</p> <p>If they work in a restaurant set up tables with plates and food to serve. Add any written material that parents brought from their job to enhance the play.</p> <p>Extension: Use pennies as a small motor set up with small tongs and cups to fill. Number the cups 1-10 for more counting</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Doctor's Office</p> <p>Using your list of parent jobs to choose a job that uses science skills to develop an activity around. If a parent works at a doctor's office or vet's office set one up in the dramatic play area.</p> <p>Children can take turns being the doctor, nurse, assistant, patient and receptionist. There are lots of jobs to do in a doctor's office. Talk about the job that parent does and add any material they brought in.</p> <p>Science Extension: painting with water and paint brushes. Children can observe the water evaporate and disappear after they are done painting</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Letters To Parents</p> <p>Materials: Paper, pencils, pens</p> <p>Children can write a letter to their parent about the work they do and why it helps the community.</p> <p>They can draw a picture about the job and their parent. Teachers can write the dictated letter to that parent.</p> <p>Mom, You work at Starbucks and you make coffee. You make people happy.</p> <p>Armando, You paint houses and help make pretty houses...</p> <p>Extension: Have envelopes to put the letter in and the child can write their name on it. Teachers can add the parents name so it looks like a real letter going home.</p> <p>Bring in examples of letters, and mail to add to the environment in a writing, art, or reading area.</p>	<p>Social emotional</p> <p>Clue Making Game and Book</p> <p>Materials: Paper, color pens and pencils</p> <p>Children can tell the group clues about their parent or community worker and the group tries to guess.</p> <p>My mom takes orders and makes coffee. What is her job?</p> <p>Teacher writes the clue on the child's paper. Children can draw the community worker. Put them all together into your school book. Clothesline Clues To Jobs Parents Do!</p> <p>Extension:</p> <p>Guess the Job Game:</p> <p>Children can take turns pretending to be a community worker from the parent display and the other children will guess. They can look at the display for ideas and then act out the job.</p> <p>Pretend play your favorite parent community worker. For example, a house painter can pretend to dip your paint brush and paint the house.</p>
